




Smallmouth Buffalo (*Ictiobus bubalus*) by Olaf Nelson. Download at moxostoma.com

- 1. Print color or black and white pages (if you don't want the fins, just print the head).
- 2. Cut out the head and fins.
- 3. Glue or tape the fins to the back of the head (glue a popsicle stick or something behind them to make them more rigid).
- 4. Hold the mask in front of your face and figure out where you need eye holes (they won't be where the buffalo's eyes are unless you have a really weird head).
- 5. Cut eye holes. NOT WITH THE MASK IN FRONT OF YOUR FACE!
- 6. Tape or glue a stick of some sort to the back of the mask (paint stirrer, ruler, etc.), OR attach a rubber band, ribbon, or other strap that you can tie behind your head, OR figure out a way to attach it to a hat.







- 1. Print color or black and white pages (if you don't want the fins, just print the head).
